12. Ethnic Crib - Chair

A metamorphosis of purpose, here's a chair that got its inspiration from the hammock, a piece of outdoor furniture found practically everywhere. In essence, it's mesh rope bed design that gives rise to this chair in contemporary style. The supporting framework is crafted of steel for durability, while the seat and backrest are made the old-fashioned way from palm fibers beautifully intertwined as if designed to hug the contour of the human body.

13. Precious Plastic

Here's a collection of planters made out of recycled waste from Precious Plastic, a project devoted to safeguarding the environment and world society founded by Dave Hakkens. It's an open source project that relies on technologies to recycle plastic waste into reusable material. The blueprints of its machines and tools, plus other techniques, can be downloaded from its website by anyone wishing to set up a small scale plant to recycle plastic waste for the creation of new products. At present, much of the information produced by Precious Plastic is available online, including how to set up a small recycling plant, business planning, and marketing.

14. Siam Flame from the Benjamin Collection

Siam Flame ceramics are part of the Benjamin Collection crafted in a delicate shade of pastels to give it a hint of contemporary style. Inspired by industrial design, it boasts the beauty of repeated patterns characteristic of machine work, despite the fact they're all perfected by human hands. Plus, the flaming torch design that's a quintessentially Thai tradition can be further adapted to fit in with the modern lifestyle, whilst effectively telling stories of the way of the community that creates it.

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15 - 16. Nil and Teo Tea Set from Memoires Collection

These beautifully crafted tea sets arise from a conversation about the most treasured memories of family roots. They represent the coming together of a family origin rich in art and craft heritage and a culture entirely different from its own. The story of a cultural confluence is told through a combination between Benjametha pottery from Pattani with the kind of Benjarong ceramics unique to Chumporn. The pleasing visual combinations speak volumes for how the two senses of history and heritage exist in perfect harmony.

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17. Ethnic Crib - Bench

Here's a bench seat inspired by the hammock, a suspended rope mesh bed seemingly ubiquitous everywhere. It illustrates traditional design being adapted to create products in more contemporary style and serving a new purpose. The framework is crafted of metal for durability, while the hand woven fabric made out of palm fiber provides a place capable of seating three.
